I. Welcome and agenda review

Dr. Paul Sechrist, Dr. Don Betz, and Mr. David Lopez each gave introductory statements.

II. Introductions

Everyone in the group stood and gave their name, title, and role. Several included that they were graduates of the University of Central Oklahoma, Oklahoma City Public Schools, and/or Oklahoma City Community College.

III. Background and history of CORE

Ms. Verna Martin and Dr. Jim Machell shared how the Affinity Network ended and CORE began with the purpose to focus on English and Math and beginning to look at the Common Core.

Dr. Machell explained that we are calling ourselves the CORE, with the intent of linking the organization to the Common Core, but it has broadened in scope.

Ms. Martin shared our three CORE Goals:

1. To identify and address institutional barriers to student retention, success, and degree completion of students. This would include work related to implementation of Oklahoma Academic (Common Core) Standards, but not be limited to only that;
2. To find opportunities for new, mutually beneficial academic programs that will improve opportunities for students and improve workforce development in the Oklahoma City metropolitan area; and
3. To provide a forum for sharing information and best practices for faculty and staff of participating institutions with others.

IV. Data presentations

Dr. Richard Weeter, Ms. Cindy Boling, and Mr. Matt Eastwood gave PowerPoint data overviews of their respective institutions.

Dr. Kerri White shared that a statewide longitudinal data system has been in the planning stages for a few years and will be rolled out before too much longer. The group was enthusiastic about this prospect.

V. Review of ELA and Math Affinity projects

Dr. Matt Hollrah shared a PowerPoint presentation reviewing the English language arts (ELA) project, and Dr. Tamara Carter shared a PowerPoint presentation on the math project.
