- Current agreement, January 1, 2006 – December 31, 2009
- Course #N4136: Clinical Nursing IV
- This clinical course is focused on nursing care for aggregates across the life-span with an emphasis on coordination of health care in a variety of settings. Strategies for influencing health care policy will be explored.
- Working with young children in a child care setting is one option the nursing students have to complete this course clinical. Students create a curriculum based on a health topic, e.g., nutrition or fighting the cold germs. Their curriculum activities are implemented in the CDCLS classroom.
- CDCLS Child Development Teachers and Lab Assistants observe, mentor and evaluate the nursing students' activities.

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- Course: Behavior and Guidance
- The course includes a lab component in which the student interacts with the children to practice appropriate guidance techniques
- CDCLS Child Development Teachers and Lab Assistants observe, mentor and evaluate the students' activities.

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- Course: Internship in Family Studies
- This is a practicum course in which the student observes the center Director's activities, participates in center planning, and implements a center project (e.g., organization of the Parent Skills Workshop Series) as assigned by the Director.
- CDCLS Director observes, mentors and evaluates the students' activities.
