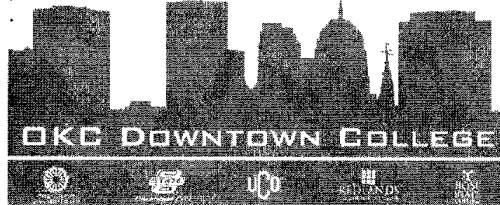

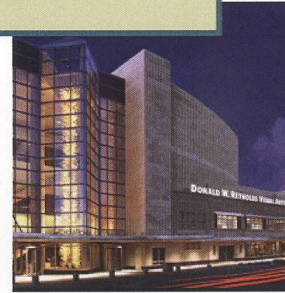

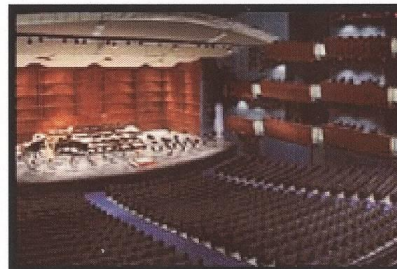

LOWER DIVISION CREDIT CLASSES:

BA 2093

PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Instructor: Staff

Fundamentals of Project Management. Deadlines get missed. There's no organized system in place to determine what needs to be done next. It's not clear how much a project will cost or what resources will be needed. There's not a clear time line of what to expect when. Everything takes longer, costs more and doesn't meet expectations when it's done, if it gets done. Fundamentals of Project Management teaches you tried and true techniques to plan and implement anything you want to get done, and keep it on time, on target and within budget. LS 2803 – 8008

Prerequisites: ENGL 1113, LS 2803; concurrent enrollment in ENGL 1113 and LS 2803 is permissible; acceptance into the Paralegal/Legal Assistant Program. Offered by Rose State College.

INTRO TO PUBLIC SERV ORGANIZATIONS (16-WK)

Introduction to principles and problems of public administration, organizational theory, budgeting, motivation and management of human resources and the political environment. Course content is focused on leadership of public/nonprofit agencies. Prerequisites: [R] [W] Offered by Oklahoma State University - OKC.

SOC 1113 (12163)

INTRODUCTION TO SOCIOLOGY (16-WK)

(Classroom plus online; four class meetings, dates)

An introduction to the science of human society with emphasis on basic concepts. Assists the student in understanding the social influences on day-to-day life. Prerequisites: [R] [W] Offered by Oklahoma State University - OKC.

GENRE SCREENWRITING I (16-WK)

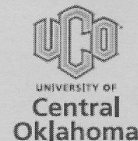
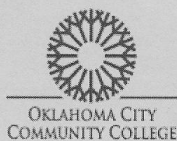
