The grandson of Margaret Sanger, who founded the birth control movement more than eighty years ago, currently serves as the Chair of the International Planned Parenthood Council. Sanger contends that the arguments for and against reproductive freedom and abortion rights have remained static for the last 30 years, as has public opinion. Sanger will take a fresh look at the pro-choice and pro-life positions. He suggests both are necessary, but insufficient.
