

# HABLE ESPAÑOL EN MÉXICO Spanish in Mexico 2000

- Speak Spanish in an authentic atmosphere.
- Visit museums, historical buildings, and churches.
- Explore the natural beauty of Lake Pátzcuaro and the rainforest of Uruapan.
- Earn three hours of college credit.\*

Spend nine days and eight nights discovering the rich cultural heritage of Mexico. Students will arrive in Guadalajara, the second largest city in Mexico, where they will spend three days and nights. Then they will travel by bus to the beautiful colonial city of Morelia in the state of Michoacán. Morelia is rich in history and culture. Lodging will be at the Hotel Alameda, located in the historical center of the city. *Acompañantes*, Mexican university students, will work with OKCCC students for an hour and a half each day in Morelia. Students will spend much of that time in Spanish conversation as they explore the city's history and culture. Students will tour Morelia's museums, colonial buildings, and historical sites. Group excursions to explore the natural beauty of Lake Pátzcuaro and the rainforest of Uruapan, where the Monarch butterflies migrate every winter, are planned.

\*Students who have completed one semester of Spanish or its equivalent will be enrolled in SPANISH 1003. Students who have completed two semesters of Spanish or more will be enrolled in SPANISH 2003.

#### **SPANISH IN MEXICO 2000 STUDENTS:**

The total cost for this 8-night, 9-day language and cultural experience is \$1195. The course begins Saturday, July 22, 2000, and ends Sunday, July 30, 2000.

#### **INCLUDED FOR \$1195:**

- Tuition and fees for three credit hours of Spanish. (Additional fees may be charged for first-time or non-resident students.)
- Round-trip airfare from Oklahoma City to Guadalajara, ground transportation to and from Morelia, and excursions in Mexico.
- Hotel lodging and two meals a day.
- Entrance fees to museums and historical sites.
- Acompañantes.

### TO ENROLL:

- Complete and detach the form below and take it to the Arts & Humanities Division office, 1E3-AH, where you will pick up the deposit payment form. The office is open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday-Friday.
- Pay the \$150 **non-refundable** deposit in the Student Store by <u>May 5, 2000</u>. If this date presents a serious problem, please contact Patricia Jiménez Brooks at 682-1611, extension 7655, or Dianne Broyles, 682-1611, extension 7657.
- You may pay the remaining cost in two payments: \$525 by May 15, 2000, and \$520 by June 15, 2000. (Of course you can pay the total amount by May15<sup>thg</sup>!) Pick up a fee payment form from the Arts & Humanities Division office and make the payment in the Student Store.
- After making your payment in the Student Store, PLEASE BRING YOUR RECEIPT TO THE ARTS & HUMANITIES DIVISION OFFICE SO A COPY CAN BE MADE FOR OUR FILES. This completes the enrollment process.
