#### 5. Committee Reports and Other Things to Share

**Curriculum—Doug**-be prepared for earlier deadlines for any curriculum proposals for the fall. Committee chairman made an announcement that there will be a deadline of three weeks before the meeting and one week for Final Draft.

IAPC-Clay- In March, IAPC responded to the OCCC Self-Study Committee's request for five years of IAPC minutes. IAPC also agreed not to accept the Student Leadership Council recommendations concerning appeal of a grade (procedure 4030); the upshot is that faculty should continue to have final responsibility for assigning grades. Procedure 4035 (student newspaper) was reviewed and no changes were recommended. Procedure 4007 (Adjunct faculty workload) was reviewed and it was decided that the policy as is allows deans reasonable latitude in assigning workload to adjunct faculty. Thus, no change. Finally, it was agreed that any college procedure or policy reviewed should also be annotated and include the date of the review.

In the April meeting, IAPC agreed to hear a proposal at the next meeting by Dr. Cheryl Stanford concerning Procedure 4002 (faculty qualifications); the issue concerns adjunct faculty with M.Ed. with English Specialties. The committee also agreed to place on the May agenda issues surrounding the number of online courses taught by full-time faculty members.
