Computer Proficiency Report

The IT division has reworded the request for a change in the computer proficiency guidelines. IT would like the divisions to discuss this and gives us feedback. The courses that are already listed as meeting the requirement would remain on the list but new courses would need to meet the new requirements.

Computer Proficiency (New Wording)

The computer proficiency requirement for graduation from OCCC should assess student competency in computer concepts and vocabulary, computer security, email, the internet, file management, word processing and presentation software.

Computer proficiency can be met by passing an assessment or successfully completing a course that has been identified through the curriculum process as evaluating at least 70% of these competencies.

SUSAN-there will be a more specific criteria developed whether or not a course will meet at least 70% of competencies, but only new courses will be evaluated.

Departments will decide whether or not classes meet computer proficiency requirements, but IT will decide that criteria.
