Curriculum Committee:

Dr. Schwark informed faculty that the phrase "Permission of Instructor" will be changed to "Evaluation by Instructor". Dr. Schwark handed out a page listing minimum competencies for reading, writing, and math for faculty reference.

She said that faculty using Angel may find that it's easier and faster. Dr. Schwark added that there will be training on Angel early in the spring.
