**I. Celebration:** Happy Birthday to Brent Stafford and Shelly Tevis!

- **II. Recognition:** Peggy Newman has been selected this year's winner of the National Institute for Staff and Organizational Development (NISOD) Teaching Excellence Award. - **III. WOW Faculty Development Initiative:** The WOW System of Faculty and Staff Development is a coordinated system that offers development activities throughout the academic year.
