II. South Facility (formerly Tower Tech) Update: At this time the new name for this facility will be the South Facility. Per Dr. Sechrist no final decisions have been made as to what departments would be moving to this campus. They are currently looking into cleaning, checking plumbing, and the access road or entrance.

III. Board of Regents: Vision of the Future (OKCCC in 2014)

SEM Center, Health Science Center, Center for the Arts, Technology, Parking, Community Education: From Dr. Todd's presentation in August the planning will go forward. John Barker's old position has been modified. This position will now be responsible for Strategic Planning and the Vision of the Future activities.

IV. USPSINCED Update: The contract with the United States Postal Service/National Center for Education has potential to generate a lot of funds for the campus and to increase the number of graduates.

V. HPS Update: Dr. Todd has identified funding for the Human Patient Simulator. The cost for the base unit (simulator) is \$153,000.00. The simulator has many functions and capabilities. The only other one in Oklahoma is located at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. It should arrive in January or February and be up and running by Summer of 2004. Each department should benefit greatly from the system.

VI. Glimpse Into the Future of Health Care: Tom reported that in the Spring semester the second semester students have a project to develop a three-day 24 hours-a-day camping experience for the Oklahoma Foundation for the Disabled. They develop a theme with all activities related to the theme.

Then in the fall third semester students mentor the first semester students at the three-day camp, which occurred this past weekend. It is a very positive experience for 25 to 27 students, and for all of the Foundation members.

Peggy attended the Annual PT Association meeting in Milwaukee. Over 1,000 students from throughout the U.S. including Alaska and Puerto Rico attended. Activities dealt with; improving the PT profession as a whole, and to elect officers. She was very encouraged by the intelligence and professionalism demonstrated by the students.

VII. Emergency Notices in the Classrooms: The Adjunct Advisory Council asked that emergency exit, telephone, etc. signs be installed in the classrooms. Dr. Sechrist has confirmed this will be done
