NEW FACULTY

Max introduced Fabiola Janiak-Spens, new Biotechnology professor.

INFORMATION ITEMS

Quarterly health and safety training will be monitored more closely in the future as well as the sexual harassment/safe environment training. If you did not do an in-class session in the fall, you must attend one this spring. Faculty and staff must do the in-class sessions. New adjuncts must do the training by the end of the semester.

Hepatitis vaccines are available for the biology and chemistry faculty. There is a concern regarding the adjunct faculty. The school pays for these vaccines. Are they high risk? We need to keep better track. Is this an individual decision? What are the legal issues? This has been available for 10 years.

The early alert system form is available on-line. Mary Turner is the contact person for this. It's a way of contacting the student when he/she is not doing well in class.

All adjuncts now have email set up and this will be the primary way of contacting them. This needs to be stressed to them. Adjuncts

will be responsible for the content. There are huge lists right now which will need to be made more useful for us. We would like to have more defined groups and possibly email lists for faculty class rosters.

There is a new Director of Curriculum and Assessment - Catherine Kinyon. She replaces Jim DeChene.

The division office has received the new IP phones along with the new voicemail system. Faculty will be receiving theirs when we move.

TODD CENTER UPDATE

We are rebuilding the schedule. The Board must approve on February 19; if approved we move on the $20^{\rm th}$, beginning with the division office, 2R0 and finishing by March $2^{\rm nd}$. Classrooms will be ready for the fall 07 classes, but not for summer. We will gain 6-7 classrooms and lose 2J5, 3P3 and 3K5. The furniture in room 3P3 was supplied by Sci/Math and was suggested that it needs to move with us.
