Dr. Yoder introduced Linda Knox from Math and Science Division and Sara Mathew of Information Technology. She asked them to share experiences as Course Coordinators in their respective divisions. Dr. Yoder stated that she was not suggesting this be implemented in our division but wanted to have the information available. Any decision to ever have Course Coordinators would be made by programs individually and not division wide.

Linda Knox stated some of her responsibilities were to write syllabi and have them printed and ready for all full time faculty and adjuncts. She works with book reps to order department materials and takes technology requests and oversees in-service training at Orientation. She chairs the committee for selecting new textbooks and sees that books are on reserve in the Library. Course Coordination is very helpful in Math when everyone has common syllabi with the same materials presented to each class. Of course, the instructor has freedom in the way the materials are presented.

There are 13 Course Coordinators in Math. It has been a long term program at least more than ten years. Merit pay is the compensation for this assignment.

Sara Mathews said most of what Linda Knox described is how Course Coordinators work in Information Technology. They have taken it a step further in that not only syllabi but also assignments and tests are standardized. This came about from complaints of students that they preferred some instructors because they were lenient or had a more relaxed attendance policy. Other instructors were said to spend extra time in one area and not enough in another so standardization eliminated those situations. They also are creating WebCt courses that are dummy courses to roll over into a course so everyone also has the same online course. Of course there is the possibility that instructors teach to the test and that can be a problem. For upper courses sometimes questions are taken from various teachers to incorporate into tests to make the transition easier for students as they go to upper level courses.
