


**Transfer Agreements between Oklahoma City Community College

Transfer Agreement

Oklahoma City Community College: AA - Art-Visual Arts
And
University of Central Oklahoma: BFA - Art-Studio Art

Total at Oklahoma City Community College.....61-64

To be taken at the University of Central Oklahoma.....60-63

(May be taken at OCCC.) This signifies that a UCO course requirement can be met with the equivalent OCCC course (found on the UCO website). To take this course at OCCC, the student should confirm that it will fit into the associate’s degree without exceeding the requirements. A minimum of 60 hours must be taken at a baccalaureate granting institution, so exceeding 64 credit hours at the community college means the student will exceed the minimum of 124 credit hour total. A minimum of 40 hours of 3/4000 level courses are required for the baccalaureate. Courses from community colleges are 1/2000 level.

Minimum Grade Requirements

1. Average in all college course work and course work at UCO.....2.75
2. Average in major courses.....2.75
3. A grade of "C" or better must be earned in each course in the major to count toward meeting degree requirements.

Students must meet all bachelor degree requirements at UCO to include minimums of:

- 40 hours of upper division coursework
- 30 hours in residence at UCO
- 15 of the last 30 hours must be taken in residence at UCO
- 60 hours from baccalaureate granting institutions
