Transferring credit for general education does not eliminate or otherwise affect any of the following ECU requirements: (1) prerequisites; (2) specific requirements in majors, minors, or related work in these areas; or (3) the requirements for teacher certification. General Education equivalencies can be found by referring to either the Oklahoma State Regents Transfer Matrix or the ECU Transfer Matrix.
- ⇒ A student must earn at least 40 semester hours in upper-division courses (numbered 3000 or higher). A course taught at OCCC may equate in content to an ECU 3000-4000 level course, but it will not be counted as part of the 40 hours of upper level courses.
- ⇒ A student must earn at least 60 semester hours, excluding physical activity courses, at a baccalaureate degree granting institution.
- \Rightarrow A Student must earn at least 124 credit hours that apply to an ECU Bachelor's degree.
