Transferring credit for general education does not eliminate or otherwise affect any of the following ECU requirements: (1) prerequisites; (2) specific requirements in majors, minors, or related work in these areas; or (3) the requirements for teacher certification. - ⇒ A student must earn at least 60 semester hours, excluding physical activity courses, at a baccalaureate degree granting institution.
- ⇒ A Student must earn at least 124 credit hours that apply to an ECU Bachelor's degree.
