Transfer and Articulation Agreement Oklahoma Baptist University and Oklahoma City Community College

Purpose

This agreement is to facilitate the transfer of students between Oklahoma City Community College (OCCC) and Oklahoma Baptist University (OBU). Transfer students may be given full credit for their hours earned when the credit is appropriate to the student's degree program and the receiving institution has validated the courses.

Goals of the articulation agreement:

- A seamless transition process that allows students from OCCC to transfer to OBU and receive the maximum allowable credit towards a baccalaureate degree.
- 2. Clear transfer guidelines and degree plans that enable OCCC students to effectively plan their transition from OCCC to OBU and gain the maximum allowable credit.
- 3. Effective means of communication to raise awareness among OCCC students of the opportunities available through this articulation agreement.

Agreement

- 1. OCCC students must meet OBU's minimum academic and admissions transfer requirements in order to be considered for admission to OBU.
- 2. Completion of at least 33 semester hours at the University out of the last 64 semester hours required for the degree. A minimum of 50% of hours completed toward the area of concentration or toward a major and a minimum of six hours toward the minor must be completed in residence. A maximum of 12 semester hours of work transferred from another accredited institution of higher education may be applied toward graduation during the senior year.
- 3. All OBU general education requirements must be fulfilled in a student's degree plan.
- 4. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better will transfer. Remedial and developmental courses will not transfer.
- 5. Representatives from OBU and OCCC will periodically update transfer and admission policies, ensure that appropriate information is readily available to OCCC students, and work together to develop mutually beneficial arrangements between the two institutions.
- 6. This agreement articulates transfer of OCCC degree programs in Business.

Either institution may change or cancel this agreement by notifying the other no less than
