

**General Education Assessment Results
FY2012**

The goal for each area is that 70% of students pass. Passing means scoring equivalent to “acceptable” or better on the rubric. For most of the rubrics, this means a score of “3” or higher. For Public Speaking, this means a total score of “14” or higher. The numbers in parentheses show the actual number of artifacts.

This year, we split the artifacts into those from traditional classes and those from online courses.
