




# AFFORDABILITY

Our international tuition and fees make college affordable. One year at OCCC, costs less than \$8,000 (USD) for 12 credit hours—the required minimum hours for international students. The average university tuition and fees in the Oklahoma City metro is \$25,000 (USD) per year. Finishing your associate degree at OCCC will allow you to transfer to a university, complete your bachelor's degree, and save you up to \$30,000 US dollars.

The chart shows estimated tuition and fees for 30 credit hours of undergraduate work per year. This does not include housing, meals, and specialized fees. Actual costs will depend on school, program, and credit hours.

# TRANSFERABILITY



Undergraduate courses at large universities are often taught in large lecture halls with 100+students. That's not done at OCCC. The average class size of 20 students allows for more interactive and collaborative learning.

OCCC provides you with a host of resources outside of the classroom. Dozens of learning labs offering free student tutoring and support. The Virtual Learning Center (VLC) is an OCCC resource that provides tips and study hacks to help you as you work to learn in your college courses.

The Keith Leftwich Memorial Library at OCCC provides further resources for a successful experience. Course reserves allow students to check out textbooks for in-library use for up to two hours at a time. Library research help is available for research assignments and papers. Collaboration and study rooms are available for students to reserve.

Once you finish your associate degree at OCCC, what's next? If you are interested in getting your bachelor's degree an OCCC associate degree will help get you there. Transfer agreements with many four-year colleges and universities allow you to easily continue your education. Not sure where to go after OCCC? # LEARNING LABS

This is just a sample of some of the most popular learning labs on the OCCC Campus:

The Accounting Lab offers free assistance to students enrolled in Accounting I and Accounting II courses. Tutors help students through the financial and managerial aspects of these courses as well as provide help with homework. If you miss a class lecture, video lectures of the material are available here.

The Biological Sciences Lab allows students flexibility in scheduling lab exercises and exams related to all biological sciences courses, including biology, anatomy, physiology, zoology, botany and microbiology. Free tutorial services are also available in the lab.

Tutors in the Communications Lab assist students with reading and writing assignments by offering suggestions for improving their writing and vocabulary and exercises to aid their study and organizational skills.

The Engineering Center is essentially two labs in one, focusing on geology and nanotechnology and electrical engineering. In the lab, students can view lecture videos, complete lab assignments and exams and complete special projects. Tutors are also on hand to answer questions.

From algebra to calculus, geometry to trigonometry, students' mathematics questions can all be answered in the college's Math Lab. In addition to free tutoring, the lab also has a variety of calculators and instruction manuals on hand for student use.


Nursing Program Campus Clinical Laboratories are designed to simulate clinical learning situations and provide students the opportunity to enhance their skills. Learning is facilitated through the use of two fully equipped labs, one which utilizes partial task trainers and the other which houses low and mid-fidelity simulators.

In the Physical Sciences Center, students in such courses as chemistry and physics are provided opportunities to view lecture videos and complete lab activities and exams. Free tutoring services are also available.

The World Languages and Cultures Center offers students help in learning foreign languages. The lab provides language-learning software, access to satellite television stations in other countries, an international film collection, and on-site tutors.

## CAMPUS SAFETY





Oklahoma has a reputation for being a safe place to live and work. OCCC is no different. The primary focus of the OCCC Campus Police Department is safety. They operate 24 hours a day, 365 days a year with officers on duty at all times.

The Campus Police Department also offers additional free safety related services such as vehicle unlock, vehicle jump start, lost and found, officer escort to and from the building, and air for vehicle and bicycle tires.

Students can easily connect to campus police with OCCC Shield, a free safety app that enables students to reach OCCC Campus Police almost immediately from their smart phones. The app connects the user to the campus police department, but also provides the user's location through an internal positioning system or geographic locator.

Each year OCCC, and all U.S. colleges, publish a report on campus crime that complies with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and the Campus Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act). This report can help you assess the safety of the U.S. college you are considering attending. In addition to physical safety, OCCC cares about a student's emotional well-being too. **Student Support Services** offers counseling to provide resources students need to cope with college-related, personal and financial issues that may be affecting their studies and their ability to be their best.

# STUDENT LIFE





Participation in student clubs and organizations provides an excellent opportunity for individuals to get acquainted with faculty, staff and students; as well as make connections to the campus community. Clubs and organizations allow students to form connections with professionals in their field of study, experience new opportunities and develop important leadership and planning skills. OCCC has approximately two dozen student organizations that you can join.

Civic Honors is a self-directed leadership and service program that enables students to receive a Civic Honors award. The program includes personal vision development, resume assistance and leadership exploration. Participants complete 50 hours of service, a student portfolio, a reflective project and two mentor sessions with Student Life staff for the award.

In addition to these extracurricular programs, OCCC also offers a variety of entertainment options through its Visual and Performing Arts Center Theater and health and wellness options through the OCCC Wellness Center. The Wellness Center is fully-equipped with top-ofthe-line weight and cardio equipment and a variety of group fitness classes.



## DEGREES

OCCC's diverse major options offer students the choice to transfer to a four-year institution or immediately enter the workforce upon completion of their OCCC degree. There are also program opportunities that help students advance in their current careers.



Oklahoma City, the capital of Oklahoma, is a growing, vibrant, and diverse city. There is no shortage of dining, entertainment and shopping experiences to explore! OCCC is located in the south part of the city, right next to Will Rogers World Airport. More than a dozen apartment complexes are located within 3 miles of the college and OKC has a citywide bus system to get you all around the metro! Embark Metro Transit (Buses 12 & 13) makes regular stops at the college, approximately one every 30 minutes.

Oklahoma has a temperate climate with cold winters, hot summers, and moderate weather in the spring and fall. Students should come prepared with appropriate clothing to accommodate the changing weather throughout the year.


