**NO. 3075 USE OF MOTOR OR BATTERY POWERED PERSONAL
CONVEYANCE VEHICLES**

- 1.0 Motor or battery powered personal conveyance vehicles shall include, but are not limited to, self-balancing scooters (hoverboards), electric/motorized skateboards and Segways. These vehicles are powered by motor or battery and may be operated off-street.
- 2.0 Motor or battery powered personal conveyance vehicles operated by the Oklahoma City Community College (OCCC) Campus Police Department, the OCCC Facilities Management Department, and any motor or battery powered personal conveyance vehicle which has been approved by OCCC for instructional purposes are excluded from this policy.
- 3.0 This policy does not apply to wheelchairs or other personal mobility devices as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act (<https://adata.org/factsheet/wheelchairs>). However, personal mobility devices should be operated in a safe manner at all times.
- 4.0 Motor or battery powered personal conveyance vehicles are prohibited from being used, stored and/or charged on the grounds or within the buildings of OCCC.
- 5.0 Members of the OCCC community are encouraged to comply voluntarily with this policy. However, where necessary, the OCCC Campus Police Department is responsible for ensuring compliance with this policy. Noncompliance may be addressed by the following means:
 - 5.1. For credit students who violate the policy, by referral to the Office of Student Life and/or by student conduct code complaint.
 - 5.2. For non-credit students who violate the policy, by referral to the appropriate department according to the specific program's policies.
 - 5.3. For employees who violate the policy, through management/supervisor intervention which may result in corrective or disciplinary action in accordance with Administrative Procedure No. 2019, Positive Discipline.
 - 5.4. For all other violators, including but not limited to contractors, visitors and non-credit students, by referral to the OCCC Campus Police Department.
