

Conjugating Spanish Verbs: Endings

	<u>AR</u>	<u>ER</u>	<u>IR</u>
Yo	o	o	o
Tú	as	es	es
Él, Ella	a	e	e
Nosotros	amos	emos	imos
Vosotros	áis	éis	ís
Ellos, Ellas, Ustedes	an	en	en

When conjugating a verb/infinitive, use the following steps.

1. Drop the ending of the verb/infinitive (**ar, er, ir**)
2. When the ending is dropped you are left with the "stem."
3. Add the endings to the verb/infinitive.

An infinitive means, "to do" something.

Examples:

<u>ER</u>	<u>IR</u>	<u>AR</u>
<u>Comer</u> (To eat)	<u>Vivir</u> (To live)	<u>Hablar</u> (To speak)
Como (I eat)	Vivo (I live)	Hablo (I speak)
Comes (You eat)	Vives (You live)	Hablas (You speak)
Come (He, She, It eats)	Vive (He, She, It lives)	Habla (He, She, It speaks)
Comemos (We eat)	Vivimos (We live)	Hablamos (We speak)
Coméis (You all eat)	Vivís (You all live)	Habláis (You all speak)
Comen (They eat)	Viven (They eat)	Hablan (They speak)
Comen Ustedes (You all eat)	Viven Ustedes (You all live)	Hablan Ustedes (You all speak)
