Note to students: This transfer map provides a semester-by-semester guide to how an Oklahoma City Community College associate in sociology transfers to OU bachelor's sociology degree program. This transfer map is based on a full-time schedule (minimum 12 hours each fall and spring semester) and is just one example of how a student may successfully complete degree requirements for both degree programs. Taking fewer than 12 credit hours per semester will lengthen your time to complete a degree. Students should work with an Oklahoma City Community College advisor and their respective OU Transfer Admissions Counselor to ensure they are on-time and on-track for transfer.

OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE Milestones and Recommended Actions:

Consider Summer Courses: Summer courses at OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE can help accelerate your time to transfer and help you stay on track. Talk to your advisor about planning summer courses.
During or After Year One at OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE: Consider a campus tour of OU-Norman and connect with an OU transfer admissions counselor, to ensure you are on track to transfer.
During Year Two at OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE: During or right after semester three coursework, apply for admission at OU-Norman as a transfer student https://www.ou.edu/admissions/apply/transfer .
Final Semester at OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE: Congratulations you are about to earn your associate degree! Be sure to apply for graduation at OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE https://onbaseweb.occc.edu/AppNet/UnityForm.aspx?key=UFKey .
Transcripts: After your final semester, submit an official OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE transcript to OU with all grades earned posted https://www.TRANSFER INSTITUTION.edu/records/transcripts/ . Make sure OU has a final transcript from all institutions where you have received college-level credit. Learn more about how to submit your final transcript to our Registrar's Office .
Reverse Transfer: Students who transfer to a university before completing an associate degree and who have earned at least 15 credit hours from OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE may be eligible to complete their OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE degree through Reverse Transfer. Email OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE Graduation Services to see if you qualify for a degree through the Reverse Transfer program.

University of Oklahoma Academic Notes and Information:

- Students must complete a minimum of 60 hours at OU to earn a bachelor's degree. This is an Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education policy.
- Students must complete a minimum of 30 hours at OU, fifteen hours must be upperdivision (3000-& 4000-level) major courses. This is an <u>Oklahoma State Regents for Higher</u> <u>Education policy</u>.
- The General Education category of Humanities is defined as any course selected from Understanding Artistic Forms, Western Civilization or World Culture. Students must complete at least 3 hours of an approved Artistic form, 6 hours Western Culture in which 3 hours must be either HIST 1483 or HIST 1493, and 3 hours of World Culture - for a total of 12 credit hours.
- At least one General Education category course must be at the upper-division level (3000 or 4000 level) <u>and</u> outside a student's major.
- A Natural Science that qualifies as physical science includes those courses from one of the following departments: AGSC, ASTR, CHEM, GEOG, GEOL, GPHY, METR, or PHYS; Biological Science departments: BIOL and HES.
- Some OU courses are only offered once per year.

OU College Specific Program Notes and Information:

- The College of Arts & Sciences requires 6 hours of upper-division General Education humanities outside of the major department and in addition to the Core IV requirement.
- College of Arts & Sciences Foreign Language Requirement:
 - a) Students must complete a minimum of one course at the intermediate/2000+ level in any foreign language. This requirement is waived for students who successfully complete a language skills assessment (<u>FLRA</u>). Students who have not completed this requirement may petition to have the requirement waived if they have completed at least 12 credit hours in a single foreign language. <u>CLEP credit</u> is also a possibility to receive at least 12 credit hours in a single foreign language. Otherwise, students must meet the requirement with either a combination of **OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE** and OU coursework or entirely at OCCC or OU.
 - b) The following **OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE** course sequences will meet the OU CAS 0-13 hour requirement for foreign language:
 - i. French: FR 1115, 1225, & 2113
 - ii. Spanish: SPAN 1115, 1225, & 2113
 - iii. German: GERM 1115, 1225 & 2113
 - iv. Additional languages are available.

 - c) Students may use the CLEP exam to meet this requirement. To do so, the student must take the national CLEP exam for specific subject credit and pass with a minimum score.

Students are responsible for understanding <u>transfer admission requirements</u> for OU and completing requirements in the official degree sheets for their selected associate and bachelor's degrees.

Transferring students can refer to OU's <u>Course Catalog</u> for specific degree and program information as well as the <u>Transfer Database</u> for specific course information. Students matriculating into the Oklahoma State System for Higher Education in Fall 2021 forward who do not complete an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science degree prior to transferring to OU, will also need to complete a <u>First Year Experience GenEd course</u>.
