


Building a Digital Collaboration Space with Zoom Whiteboard


Upgrade your lecture or meeting by sharing a digital Zoom whiteboard. The whiteboard feature in Zoom is an excellent opportunity to build a collaborative workspace for your online and face-to-face participants. Check out the different engaging ideas on implementing the whiteboard into your next online lecture, meeting, or face-to-face class.



Upgrade Your Brainstorming Session:


Use the whiteboard in your lecture or meeting to engage participants in discussion or brainstorming ideas. Participants can jot down ideas and organize thoughts faster together. The multiple whiteboard feature allows you to assign students to specific boards and topics and enable everyone to collaborate in different areas.





Build Topic Diagrams Together:

Use the toolbar features to build thinking diagrams. This is a great way to check for student understanding, and it allow students to map out concepts or content to show their knowledge.



Make Content Interactive:

Use the Zoom room camera and the whiteboard together to build interactive lessons. Participants can work alongside you on their whiteboard. The Zoom whiteboard has a multiple-screen function. Have participants open their whiteboards to work.



Connect the Content:

Give participants open-ended prompts and ask them to respond on the whiteboard. Draw separate sections in the whiteboard, and ask students to discuss different aspects of a topic, potentially to assess prior knowledge of a new topic or to affirm their learning after teaching a topic.





Wrap Up, Check Off, and Plan:

Use the whiteboard as a tool to wrap up thoughts and make an idea check off list visible for participants. Use the whiteboard at the end of a meeting or lecture to let participants have a visual to save as a PDF.
